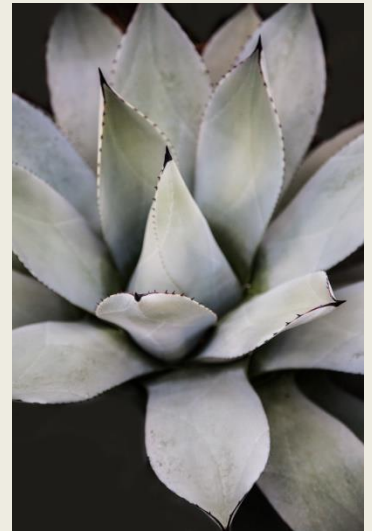


DROUGHT TOLERANT PLANT LIST
